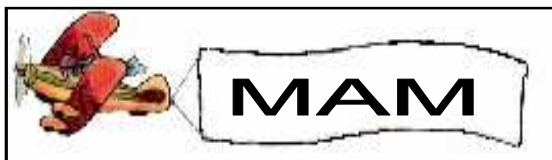



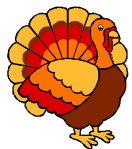
We cleaned the flower beds and protected trees from critters.....

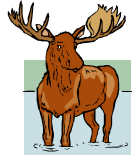

MAM SAFETY RULES

Each month thru March this column will feature our Safety Rules. Here's the first installment. If you have questions or need clarification regarding any of the Rules listed below, ask for discussion at our next monthly membership meeting.

1. The **ACADEMY OF MODEL AERONAUTICS**

Safety Code will be observed at all times. This code is posted on the frequency control board at the field.



2. The Club Safety Officer's requests will be observed. The Safety Officer has the last word and may ground airplane or pilots that present potential safety hazards. Disputes over safety rule interpretations will be discussed and resolved at the next Board meeting.

3. Any non-member that wishes to fly at Minot Aircraft Modelers field must have a CURRENT



AMA NATIONAL MEMBERSHIP card, pay a \$3.00 daily guest fee and have a member of MAM present, resident members of other ND clubs are exempt from the daily fee.

4. Airplanes shall not be started in any area other than in the areas of the start up tables, also defined as the Pit Area. A second person or a restraining device if possible should always hold the aircraft during engine starting and check out. The aircraft's prop blast should be directed away from other individuals or aircraft. NO restarts on the runways.



NOMINATION OF OFFICERS

At the November meeting, nominations for officers will be accepted.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Election of Officers is held each year at the December meeting....Below is Article VII of MAM By Laws for your review.



Article VII Election of Officials

1. Election of Club officials shall be conducted annually at the last regular monthly meeting (Dec.) held during the fiscal year. Only full voting members shall be eligible to hold office.
2. Vice President will be nominated by the President following his election.
3. Nominations for all offices shall be made by the general membership at the November meeting of each fiscal year. Additional nominations may also be made at the December meeting prior to balloting.
4. Unsuccessful Presidential, Secretary, and Treasurer candidates may also be considered for Board Members at Large positions if they so desire.



Winter Weather Information for

All Season Fliers

Exposure to cold can cause frostbite or hypothermia and become life-threatening.

Frostbite is damage to body tissue caused by extreme cold. A wind chill of -20° Fahrenheit (F) will cause frostbite in just 30 minutes. Frostbite causes a loss of feeling and a white or pale appearance in extremities, such as fingers, toes, ear lobes or the tip of the nose. If symptoms are detected, get medical help immediately. If you must wait for help, slowly re-warm affected areas. However, if the person is also showing signs of hypothermia, warm the body core before the extremities. Be careful out there this Winter!
